FACE MASKS, NO RELIGIOUS GATHERINGS, TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS – SOME THOUGHTS

What strange times we are living in! If you'd told me 12 months ago – even 9 months ago – that our Government would ban Christian gatherings, bring in an 8pm curfew in Melbourne, and force everyone in Victoria to wear masks whenever they go out, I would have laughed at such ridiculous ideas. Short of an invasion by a foreign country, how could such things be? And yet, that is now our reality.

Some of my friends think the restrictions are unnecessary, that it's all about getting the population to submit to some kind of end-times satan-inspired agenda.

Some people think it's a world domination plot from Communist China. Conspiracy theorists are adamant that we cannot trust the media sources that continually update us on the latest Covid-19 news.

Some people are angry, others are scared, some getting more and more ornery (like that word?) with every week that passes.

From my position at the bookshop in the middle of Moe, I observe that nearly everyone is following the regulations this time around. I haven't heard of any churches that are defying the restrictions; rather, they are seeking ways to do church within the regulations.

Question: how should we balance the principle in Acts 5:29 – We ought to obey God rather than men" with Romans 13:1-7, where Paul tells us to obey government authorities?

Firstly, in the Acts reference, the disciples were talking about the religious authorities, not the civil ones. Jesus, likewise, rebuked the Pharisees for imposing their man-made rules on the people of God.

But secondly, the situation is different because, conspiracy theories aside, there really is a kind of invasion happening that demands a sacrificial response from us all. The real question we face as Christians in this time is not "Should we obey the regulations?" but "How can we be the best possible witness for Christ in these times?"

And one last thing. I freely confess that I have detested some of the policies that our Premier has championed over the years. But now, I'm praying for the man. He is paying a very heavy price. Everyone needs Jesus. That is the one truth that should be our constant prayer focus.
